# <u>Tampa Radio Control Aircraft Club – Proposed Reopening Plan</u>

## <u>Introduction</u>

Tampa Radio Controlled Aircraft Club (TRAC) is comprised of approximately 90 members (number varies seasonally) who enjoy the sport of flying radio-controlled model aircraft.

TRAC operates on an 11.8-acre site provided under lease by Hillsborough County at 7208 Taylor Road, Seffner, Fl. The flying site is on the Solid Waste Department Division's property adjacent to the north side of the Hillsborough Heights Landfill.

# **Key Elements of Reopening**

#### 1) Employee Protocols:

N/A - TRAC has no employees. The only working people routinely at the field are two mowing crews (one private company paid by TRAC, and one from the County) and a technician from United Site Services (services the porta-potty weekly).

#### 2) Virtual Appointments & Appointments vs. Walk-In

N/A - No services, other than the 11.8-acre flying site, are provided to TRAC members. There is more than adequate space in the parking lot, shelter and pit area, and pilot stations for social distancing.

### 3) Screening:

No plan is being made to screen pilots. It is a large, outdoor site. Members are instructed that they should not come to the field if they have any symptoms to maintain public health.

## 4) COVID-19 Case Reporting:

There is no enclosed building other than a storage shed (normally only used during events - now cancelled). Should there be a known or suspected Covid-19 case at the field, we will notify Parks and Solid Waste.

#### 5) Visitor Entry & Circulation:

Being on County property we welcome all to visit and experience the radio control sport. That said, we have visitors only infrequently and mostly to attend club events (now cancelled). Considering the current situation, if the County approves, TRAC will ask any visitors to leave the site until the situation changes. Further, TRAC will limit the number of members at the field to just individuals who are flying, rather than just coming out to be social.

#### 6) COVID-19 Workspace Planning:

Currently, the "workspace" at the field includes three picnic tables under a large tin-roof shelter (with no walls), and seven smaller work benches in the pit area for aircraft preparation. All the tables are spaced at least six feet apart. Normal simultaneous active table use by members does not exceed the number of separate tables. If we determine that the highest demand usage (weekends) exceeds the number of tables and/or private vehicle tailgates, we will limit the capacity.

#### 7) Common Area Spaces:

N/A - There are no enclosed common areas. The guidance provided by the County will be posted at the field to remind members of appropriate Covid-19 practices.

### 8) Daily Disinfection Protocols:

TRAC will provided hand sanitizer and wipes on the picnic tables and in the portapotty. We will also ask that club members bring their own supply in case the supplied material is temporarily out.

### 9) Signage Communications:

TRAC will post signs with County's guidance (near the entrance, and at the shelter). Members will be encouraged to use face masks.

### 10) Employee Training:

N/A - TRAC has no employees or managers.
